

Advancing Energy Abundance through Digital Infrastructure: From Hyperscale to Distributed Compute

Artificial intelligence is reshaping global energy markets. From hyperscale data centres to localized processing integrated with distributed systems, digital demand is increasingly influencing how power and broadband projects are structured, financed, and scaled. For Africa, this moment presents a strategic opportunity: leveraging growing digital loads as anchor demand to strengthen the economics of both grid-connected and distributed energy systems. By improving utilization and revenue stability—particularly for mini-grids—integrated power-digital models can accelerate electrification and digital connectivity for people and economies while reducing cost pressures for underserved communities.

- How can distributed energy systems capture growing digital and AI-driven demand while simultaneously expanding affordable household electricity and broadband connectivity?
- What commercial structures—anchor offtake agreements, blended finance, risk mitigation instruments, and hard-currency revenue streams—can improve scalability and investor confidence?
- How can integrated energy-digital infrastructure unlock two-way U.S.–Africa economic opportunity, supply-chain development, and long-term competitiveness?
